All bunkers are now open on the course and we would encourage members feedback on the work carried out. All the mounds are growing in nicely with the new grass.

Over the past 3 weeks Oisin has been rolling the greens at least once a week to help speed them up, growth has finally kicked in this was a big issue for our greens before the start of May. They were also sprayed with Iron to help with growth, this is why they have been a darker colour for the past week. They are now rolling well. In the next couple of weeks (depending on weather) Oisin will be giving them a final dusting of sand which should take them through until the end of the playing season.

All new 'Hole Cups' and "Flag Poles have been added this week, these poles are Javelin poles used on Links Courses due to the wind.

All rivers will be getting cleaned in the next couple of weeks.

Can I please ask all members to repair pitch marks, your own and at least one other on every green!

Please also use divot bags were possible and fill in divots. If you can check your Car Boot/Golf Bag as the divot bags are running low.

We will be running a Litter Pick/Divot evening very soon and it would be great to get as many members as possible to help for a couple of hours. Information on that to follow. (See page 1 for more information)

- Our 7<sup>th</sup> annual Club Classic takes place on the weekend of 16<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> of June. - We had a recent audit from the Health and Safety Authority who focused in on our traffic management plan of the car park area. We have put a speed limit sign in place, and can I ask that all members and staff, <u>do not</u> park in any area that is not lined as a parking spot as you are causing an obstruction for vehicles and buggies getting past the areas and blocking our fire assembly point. You shouldn't be parked there anyway. If the car parking spaces are full, cars can park along the wall adjacent to the 18 green. This will be monitored over the coming months. Thank you for your co-operation in advance.
- I have obtained an energy grant for Sports Ireland for the rise in energy costs. This amounted to €8776.00.
- I have applied to have 2 electric car charging points installed in the car park. (Grants available) More than likely 2024 before they will be available.
